Hawkesbury Local Section Dinner and Talk with David Stringer

Members and guests are cordially invited to join us for our third meeting of the 2014-2015 season, on Tuesday, November 18, which will include dinner at Restaurant Carole, followed by a talk by Dr. David Stringer on the restoration and construction at ground zero in New York City.

Following the destruction of the two original towers at the World Trade Center site on September 11, 2001, the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation organized a competition to determine the most suitable solution for the reconstruction of the site. The winning proposal was to build four new towers, a memorial museum and gardens and a new transportation hub.

Contracts were awarded to Canadian contractors for the construction of two of the new towers and for the construction of the transportation hub. In addition, Canadian contractors were involved in the restoration of adjacent buildings which had been severely damaged by falling debris from the collapse of the two original towers.

The presentation will describe the construction engineering involved in the restoration of the “Winter Garden” and in the construction of the new Tower One (the “Freedom Tower”), the new Tower Four, and the new Transportation Hub at the World Trade Center (“Ground Zero”) in New York City.
