Terms of reference

The Canadian Society for Chemical Engineering offers two CSChE Chemical Engineering Local Section Scholarships annually to undergraduate students in chemical engineering at a Canadian university.

Sponsor

Sponsored by the Edmonton CSChE, the Sarnia CIC, and the London CIC Local Sections. Funded by the proceeds acquired at the 1988 Canadian Chemical Engineering Conference, held in Edmonton, Alberta, the 1979 Chemical Engineering Conference, held in Sarnia, Ontario, and the 1998 Canadian Chemical Engineering Conference held in London, Ontario.

Deadline

April 30 annually

Award

A certificate and \$2,000 cash for each scholarship. Up to two scholarships may be given out annually.

Eligibility

Applicants must be undergraduate students in chemical engineering entering their final year of studies at a Canadian university. The scholarships will look at academic performance, leadership qualities, and demonstrated contributions to the CSChE, such as participation in Student Chapters. Applicants must be paid undergraduate student members of the Canadian Society for Chemical Engineering.

Application

Application letters should document contributions to the Society. Please provide a transcript of academic performance, and two (2) letters of support along with the application letter. Applications must be submitted electronically.

Selection

The selection committee consists of the CSChE Director of Student Affairs as non-voting chair and one member from each participating Local Section.
