



Roles of the Canadian Society of Chemistry (CSC) Board of Directors and Officers

Directors / Officers

President (1-year term)

Provides leadership to the CSC Board of Directors. Chairs the CSC Executive Committee. Accountable for leading, development and implementation of strategy and carrying out programs and services according to the bylaws and policies of the CSC Board. Prepares to potentially serve a future term as Past-President. Presides over/member of selected committees, e.g., HR and compensation, strategy, finance and is a member of the Chemical Institute of Canada (CIC) Board.

Vice-President (1-year term)

Acts in the absence of the President. Member of the CSC Executive Committee. Learns duties of the President and key issues and works closely as a consultant and advisor to the President. Prepares to potentially serve a future term as President. Presides over/member of selected committees, e.g., strategy, governance and nominations, and awards.

Past President (1-year term)

Supports the current President. Works closely with the Executive Committee to advise and provides historical continuity. Member of the CSC Executive Committee. Chair of the governance and nominations committee for the CSC Board.

Treasurer (3-year term)

Responsible for the Finances of the CSC Board. Ensures proper accounting records and practices are in place and is responsible for the deposit of monies, the safekeeping of securities and the disbursement of the funds of the CSC. Member of the CSC Executive Committee. Member of the finance committee for the CIC.
