

The ACS Green Chemistry Institute Student Travel Award

The ACS Green Chemistry Institute Student Travel Award is presented to undergraduate or graduate students who have made significant contributions to advancing green and sustainable chemistry or engineering through their research or teaching endeavours. This award will sponsor students studying at Canadian institutions to attend the Canadian Chemistry Conference and Exhibition (CSC) or the Canadian Chemical Engineering Conference (CSChE) during the awarded year to present their work as an oral or poster presentation in a symposium organized/co-organized by the CIC Green Division.

Deadline: December 15, 2025, midnight PST.

Sponsor: The award was generously sponsored by the ACS Green Chemistry Institute.

Award:

- A certificate recognizing the student's accomplishments.
- \$500 CDN cash prize to reimburse qualifying expenses including conference registration and/or travel expenses.
- The award shall be presented at the Canadian Chemistry Conference and Exhibition (CSC), the Canadian Chemical Engineering Conference (CSChE), or an event chosen by the CIC Green Division.

Eligibility: Undergraduate and graduate students studying at Canadian institutions are eligible to apply for this award. Applicants do NOT need to be Canadian citizens or Permanent Residents. Membership in the Chemical Institute of Canada or with the Green Division is not a prerequisite for the award.

Nomination Requirements: Application packages should be submitted to cicgreendiv@gmail.com.

The candidate is required to submit the following package as ONE file (PDF or Word):

- Curriculum vitae (2 pages maximum): be sure to include educational background (degrees, field of study, year earned or expected), work experience and list of publications (if any)
- Statement of Impact (1 page maximum): a short description of your research and/or educational efforts in green chemistry and/or engineering and impacts of the award on career progress. Be sure this outlines your specific contributions and not a broad description of a research or education program you are involved with.

• Conference Abstract (1 page maximum): an oral or poster presentation abstract for submission to a symposium organized or co-organized by the CIC Green Division. Be sure to include the type of presentation and the title of the symposium for which you are applying.

The candidate's nominator (applicant's faculty advisor, supervisor, or department chair) is required to submit the following:

• Letter of nomination (2 pages maximum): a description of the student's activities related to green chemistry and/or engineering highlighting the impacts of the award on student progress and career development. A brief statement of financial need for travel support may be included, if applicable. This letter should be submitted separately by the nominator.

Selection Committee:

- Chair of the CIC Green Division
- Two other members from the executive board of the CIC Green Division

This award shall be presented annually unless the selection committee considers that no suitable candidates have been nominated. For more information email <u>cicgreendiv@gmail.com</u>.
